Seizing authority		
Strong's definition of "exercise authority" in verse 12 - authenteō: (1) one who with his own hands kills another or himself; (2) one who acts on his own authorty, autocratic; (3) an absolute master; (4) to govern, exercise dominion over.		
Not the usual word for authority: exousia, regarding rightly-given power.

A Challenge to Men


Search your hearts as to how you view women.
